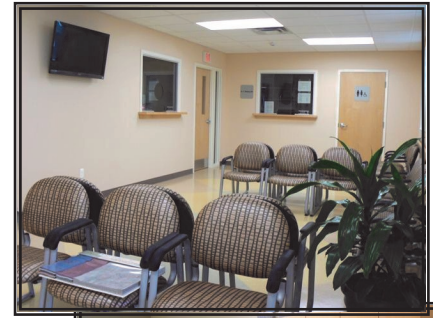
## Now open Centre de santé A.M. Clark Health Centre

A special thanks goes out to **Odette Rohland** who submitted the winning name of the medical centre located in Pubnico.

Dr. Alexander (Sandy) Clark practiced medicine in Pubnico for 27 years from 1967-1992. He was a very active part of the community and a long time member of the Pubnico and Area Lions Club. Dr. Clark passed away in December of 2009 at the age of 87. Dr. Clark's former office and home were located within a kilometre of our new centre.

The centre is fully equipped and state of the art and currently houses Dr. Jacqueline d'Eon, Dr. Terry Rohland, and Nurse Practitioner Duana d'Entremont.

This centre is a partnership project between the Municipalities of Argyle, Yarmouth and the Town of Yarmouth.

# Senior Care Navigator

New to our area, the Seniors Safety Program is a free service to seniors and their families. The goal of the program is to support, sustain and value the safety and well being of seniors in Yarmouth County. To do this we will offer a series of educational workshops throughout the area, do home visits and assist with referrals to other agencies.

In Southwest Nova the senior population averages 18% of our community and continues to grow rapidly. The capacity to meet the specific needs of our seniors has to expand - not just within the health care system, but including mental health, education, economics and the legal field.

Requests for presentation have included: Power of Attorney, Fraud & Scams, Household Safety & Falls Prevention, Friendly Visitors Program, Elder Abuse, Preparing to Move, Dating & New Relationships, to name a few.

The Seniors Safety Program is a small beginning and will hopefully grow to all residents to participate and thus enhance the well being of our seniors.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE

**The two bag program for recycling has been a requirement in our area since January 2005.**

**Effective September 6, 2010** the blue bagged recyclables that are not sorted properly will be rejected. This will effect all residents and businesses in Digby and Yarmouth counties.

For a limited time, NB Translation is offering a "Translation Assistance Program" that is aimed at increasing market access to small and medium sized businesses in the Atlantic Region.

Financial assistance will be provided to for profit companies who wish to translate their promotional material into one of Canada's two official languages. Each successful applicant can receive up to 75% of eligible costs incurred up to a maximum of \$2500.

Items to be translated may include website content, brochures, pamphlets, specs and technical sheets, product labels and packaging, etc. Eligible applicants include: most for profit business sectors such as manufacturing sectors providing goods and services to industry & businesses and most tourism operations.
